4 Day Infection Prevention & Control Course

Information



What is involved in the course?

The four day course will take place over two days on week one and two days on week two. A wide range of hot topics will be addressed

Who should attend this course?

This course is aimed at frontline acute hospital staff and is particularly relevant for senior staff nurses, infection prevention and control (IPC) link nurses & champions, newly appointed IPCNs, clinical nurse managers, NCHDs, microbiology registrars, allied health professionals, and those who are interested in patient safety and wish to update their core IPC knowledge and skills.

What are the aims and objectives of the course?

On completion of the course, attendees will:

- Understand the importance of their role in preventing healthcare associated infections (HCAIs)
- Have a greater understanding about key aspects of IPC and prevention of antimicrobial resistance
- Have enhanced their core knowledge
 and skills in IPC
- Have learned about the use of quality improvement initiatives to translate learning into daily practice

What topics will be covered?

Some of the topics to be covered by a panel of guest lecturers from Ireland and abroad will include:

- Basic microbiology and multi-drugresistant organisms e.g. CPE.
- Standard and transmission-based
 precautions
- Aseptic non-touch technique (ANTT)
- Management of invasive medical devices
- Outbreak management
- Surveillance of HCAI
- Antimicrobial stewardship
- Environmental hygiene
- Quality improvement
- Root cause analysis (RCAs)

When and where is the course?

The course will be held in the Houston Lecture theatres, Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland (RCSI) Stephen's Green, Dublin across four days in September 2018: Tuesday 4th, Wednesday 5th, Monday 10th and Tuesday 11th, from 9am-4pm.

Is there an exam at the end of the course?

No. All attendees will receive a certificate of attendance. Approval from the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Ireland (NMBI) is under review. An application for RCPI CPD accreditation will only be submitted if >10 medical doctors apply for the course.

What does the course cost?

The cost of the course is €100 per attendee. The provision of this course at such a low cost is due to the ongoing support and commitment of the RCSI and the lecturers who generously give their time and resources for free.

Presentations

Where possible, lecture handouts will be made available to attendees on the HPSC website **<u>after</u>** the course.

Refreshments

Morning coffee and biscuits will be provided each day.

Attendees will provide their own lunch. There is a small canteen in the RCSI that attendees are welcome to use.
