

Acute flaccid Paralysis (AFP); a clinical syndrome characterised by rapid onset of weakness, including (less frequently) weakness of respiratory muscles and swallowing, progressing to maximum severity within several days to weeks. The term "flaccid" indicates the absence of spasticity or other signs of disordered central nervous system motor tracts such as hyperreflexia, clonus, or extensor plantar responses. AFP is a complex clinical syndrome with a broad array of potential aetiologies. Surveillance of AFP is of great public health importance because it is used in surveillance for poliomyelitis in the context of the global polio eradication initiative Publication Date: 01/03/2023
