



## Ambulance Service: Infection Prevention and Control Precautions for Suspected or Confirmed Influenza<sup>1</sup>

When the Ambulance Control Centre is informed that a patient is suspected or confirmed to have seasonal influenza the following precautions should be taken by ambulance personnel:

### 1. On arrival to the house/transfer facility

- A. Decontaminate hands (alcohol gel/rub)
- B. Routine care:
  - ≥ 5 years of age: Wear surgical mask. Plastic apron/gown gloves & goggles if risk of blood or body fluids exposure anticipated as per Standard Precautions.
  - < 5 years of age: Wear surgical mask, gloves and plastic apron/gown (goggles if risk of spraying or splashing of blood or body fluids).

**C. Aerosol generating procedures** (AGP) and while remaining in or entering patients' room within one hour of cessation of an AGP (refer to <u>Aerosol</u> <u>Generating Procedure Document</u> for updated list of AGPs)

 FFP2 or FFP3 mask (fit check to ensure a good seal), goggles, long sleeved disposable gown and gloves (<u>Donning and removing PPE</u> <u>document</u>)

# 2. Inform the hospital of the admission/transfer of a potentially infectious person

#### 3. Before leaving the house/healthcare facility

- Request patient to wear a surgical mask and advise of <u>Respiratory</u> <u>Hygiene and Cough Etiquette</u>
- A patient with suspected or confirmed flu should not travel with any other patients

#### 4. In ambulance

- Wash hands before, after and change gloves if applicable patient contact.
- Use single use or single patient use medical equipment where possible
- Use disposable linen if available

#### 5. Arrival to hospital

- Before the patient leaves the ambulance ensure arrangements are in place for receipt of the patient
- Transfer patient to the care of hospital staff
- After transfer of patient remove PPE (Donning and removing PPE document)

#### 6. Before ambulance is used again

- Cleaning and disinfecting (wear appropriate PPE while cleaning)
  - Surfaces (stretcher, chair, door handles etc) should be cleaned with a detergent and a hypochlorite solution 1000pmm
- Laundry
  - Place reusable blankets in an alginate bag, then into a red laundry bag and send for laundering
- Medical equipment
  - Follow manufacturer's instructions for cleaning/disinfecting reusable equipment
- Management of waste
  - All masks and any waste contaminated with blood or body fluid (including respiratory secretions) should be disposed of as Healthcare Risk waste
- Management of sharps per <u>Standard Precautions</u>
- Management of spillages of blood and body fluids per <u>Standard</u> <u>Precautions</u>
