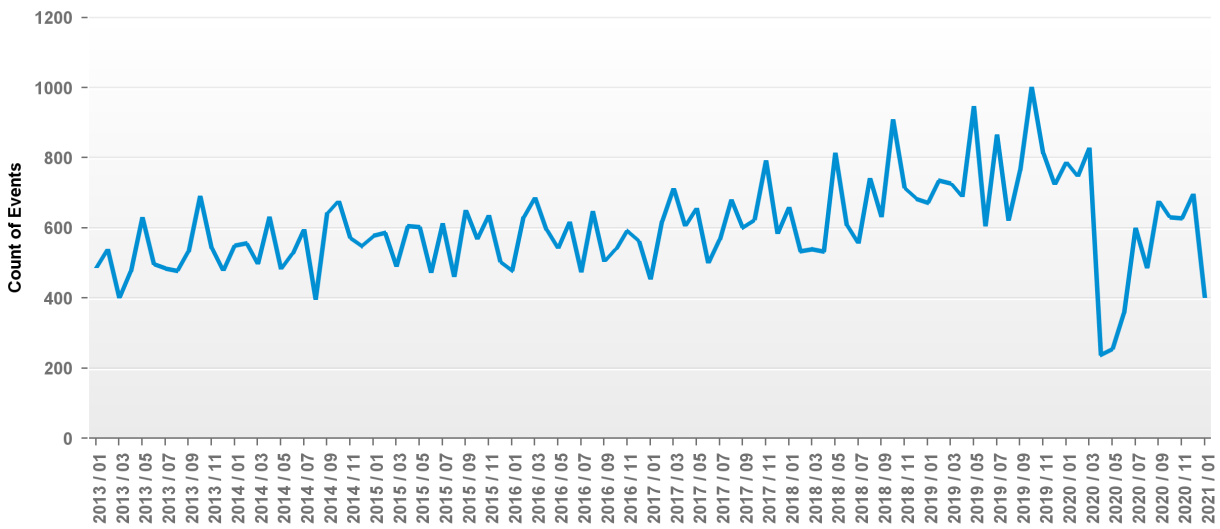

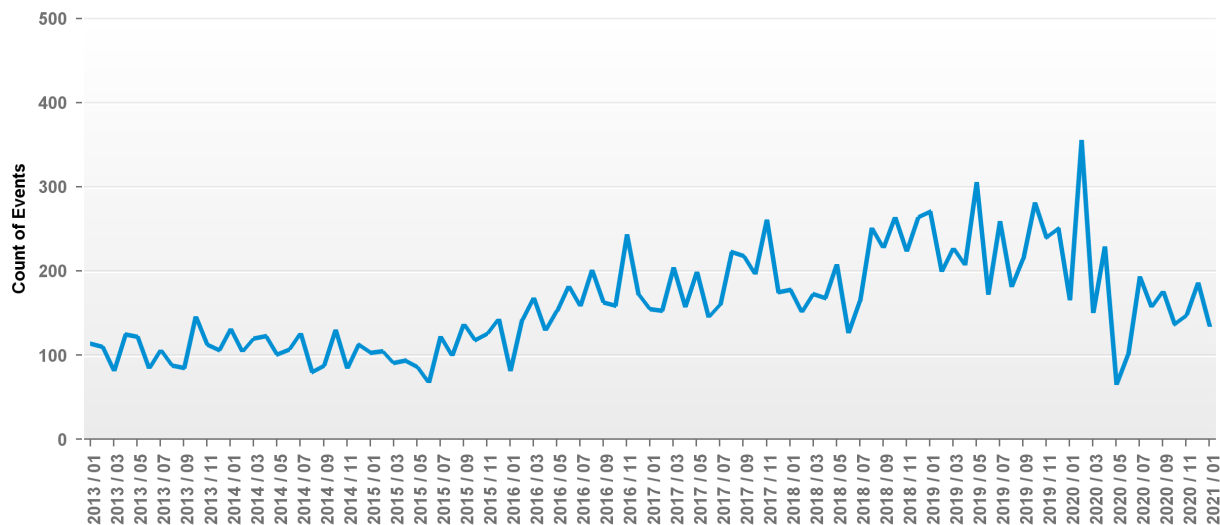

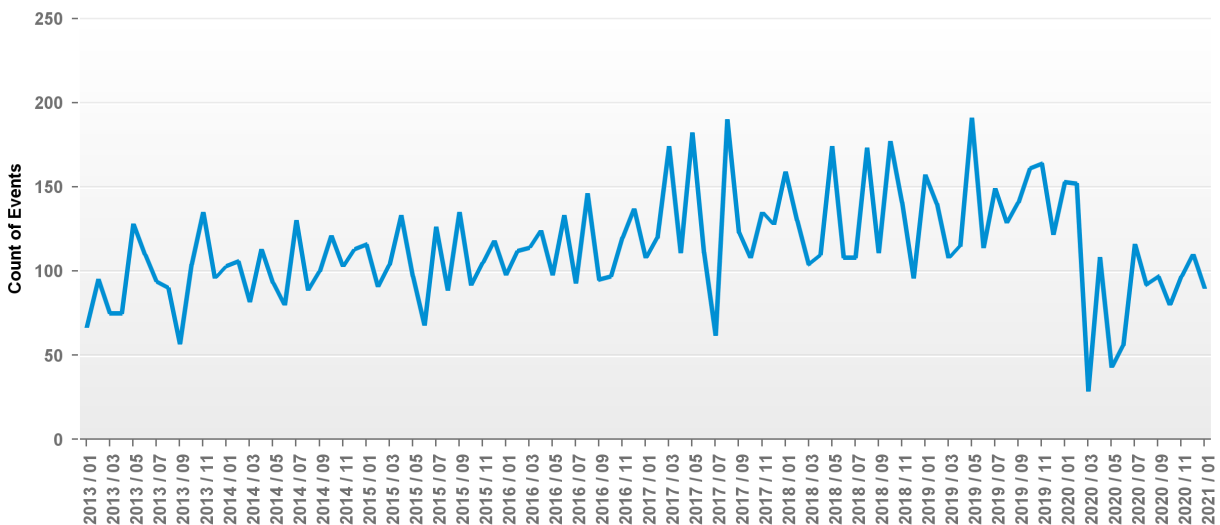
Graph 1: Chlamydia notifications by month, week 1, 2013 - week 4, 2021



Graph 2 : Gonorrhoea notifications by month, week 1, 2013 - week 4, 2021

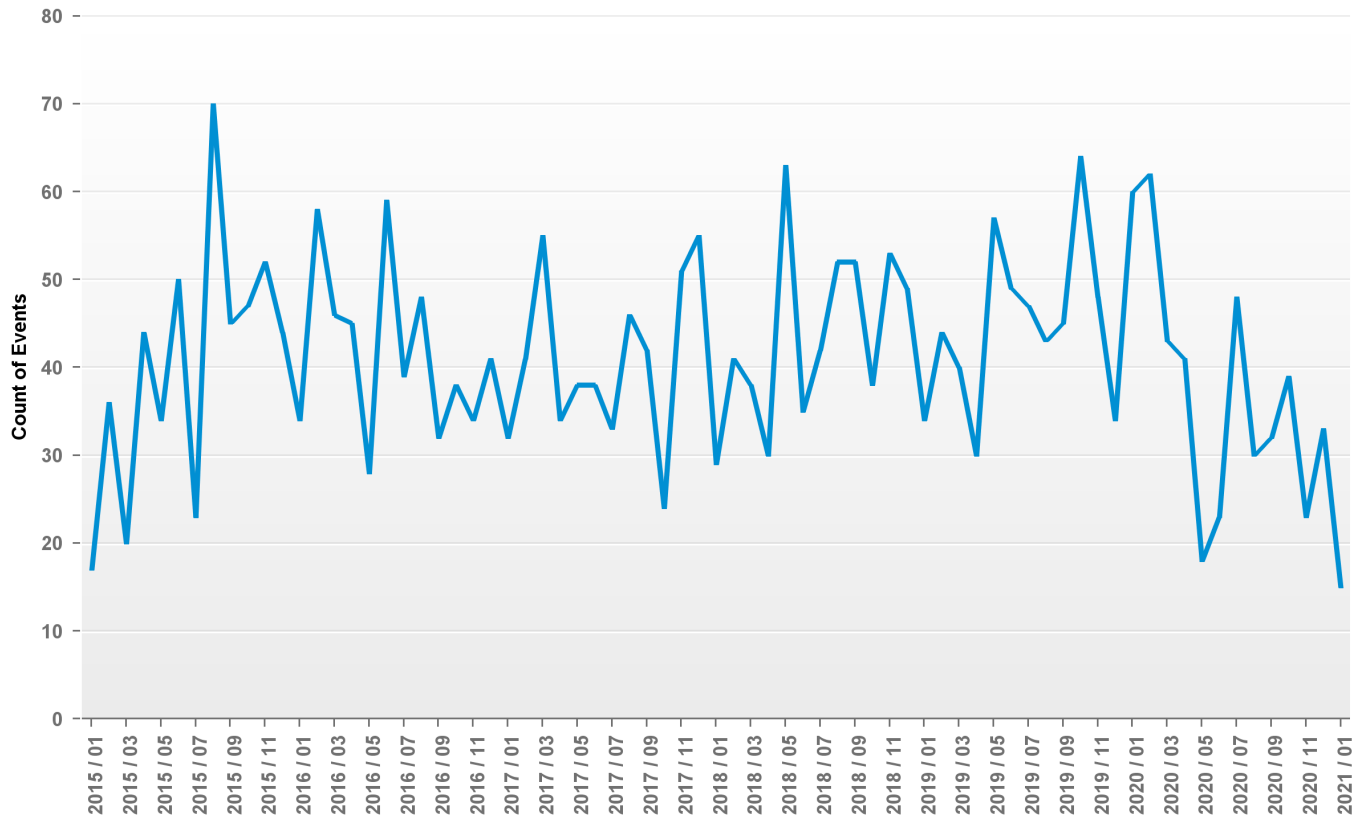


Graph 3: Herpes simplex (genital) notifications by month, week 1, 2013 - week 4, 2021

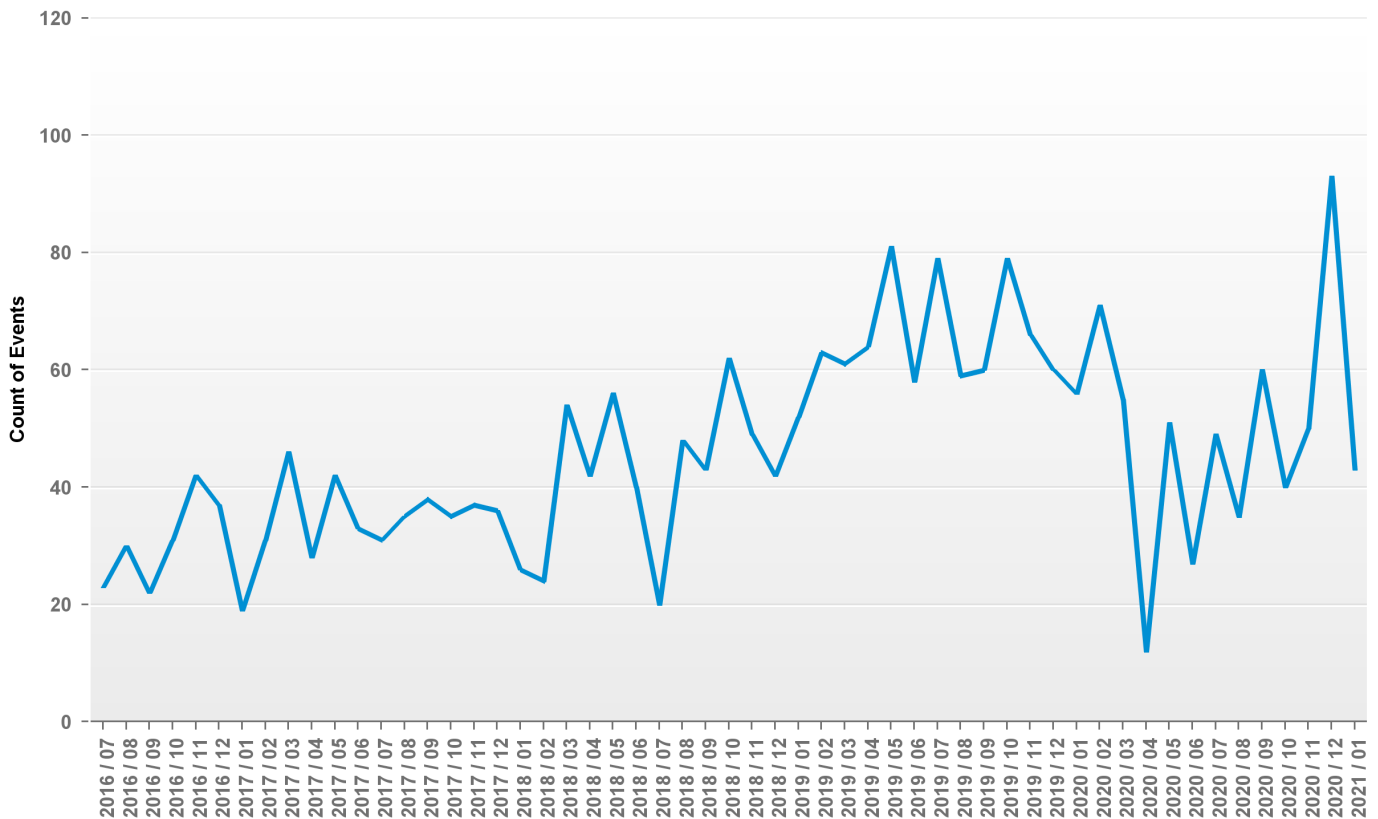




Graph 4: HIV notifications by month, week 1, 2015 - week 4, 2021

## **Guidance notes**

1. This report contains data on notifiable STIs (excluding Ano-Genital Warts (AGW) and Non-Specific Urethritis (NSU)), and HIV reported weekly to Departments of Public Health from clinical or laboratory sources. Data included in this report are based on the date the information is entered into/authorised on CIDR by Public Health.

2. Data for this report are provisional and were extracted from CIDR on 03 February 2021, and were correct at the time that data were extracted. Information from previous years is updated on an ongoing basis in CIDR, therefore data in this report may be updated in future reports.

3. Aggregate data on AGW and NSU are reported to HPSC on a quarterly basis from Departments of Public Health and are reported in the annual STI reports.

4. The counties covered by each HSE area are as follows:  
HSE East (E): Dublin, Kildare & Wicklow;  
HSE Midlands (M): Laois, Longford, Offaly & Westmeath;  
HSE Midwest (MW): Clare, Limerick & N. Tipperary;  
HSE Northeast (NE): Cavan, Louth, Meath & Monaghan;  
HSE Northwest (NW): Donegal, Leitrim & Sligo;  
HSE South (S): Kerry & Cork;  
HSE Southeast (SE): Carlow, Kilkenny, S. Tipperary, Waterford & Wexford;  
HSE West (W): Galway, Mayo & Roscommon.

5. The Irish case definition for syphilis changed on 1st January, 2014 and from this date, syphilis notifications include early (infectious) syphilis only. Direct comparison of 2014 syphilis notification data with notification data for previous years (which includes non-infectious cases) is not valid. In July, 2016, the laboratory criteria were updated and since January, 2019, symptomatic cases which do not meet the laboratory criteria are notifiable as probable cases.
